It appears that it has been decided that the tower and a number of hangars would be removed and or moved to allow a passageway east of the Alpha taxiway for movement of fuel trucks etc and moving the runway to the East. As laudable and necessary as that is basically this would be a disaster for the community. This may impact multiple structures that exist east of the taxiway. The hangar space could not be replaced as there is not enough land to do this. The economics of condemning a hanger would be economically a disaster for the owners. Hangar space is at a premium currently as I personally know many pilots that would like to buy an aircraft
